at the galler until October 20. The labyrinth is not unlike sitting through multiple screenings of Andrei Tarkovsky's 1972 film Solaris. It incorporates aural, visual, structural and technological stimuli in the form of an ever altering series of enclosures with sames such as Underworld and Paperbag.

Compile by students at the Auckland University School of Architecture, the labyrinth was first envisaged by Dr Leonhard Oberascher, a noted colourist, designer and psychologist. Dr Oberascher holds a lecture on light and colour at the Pakuranga Community Centre auditorium on October 8.
